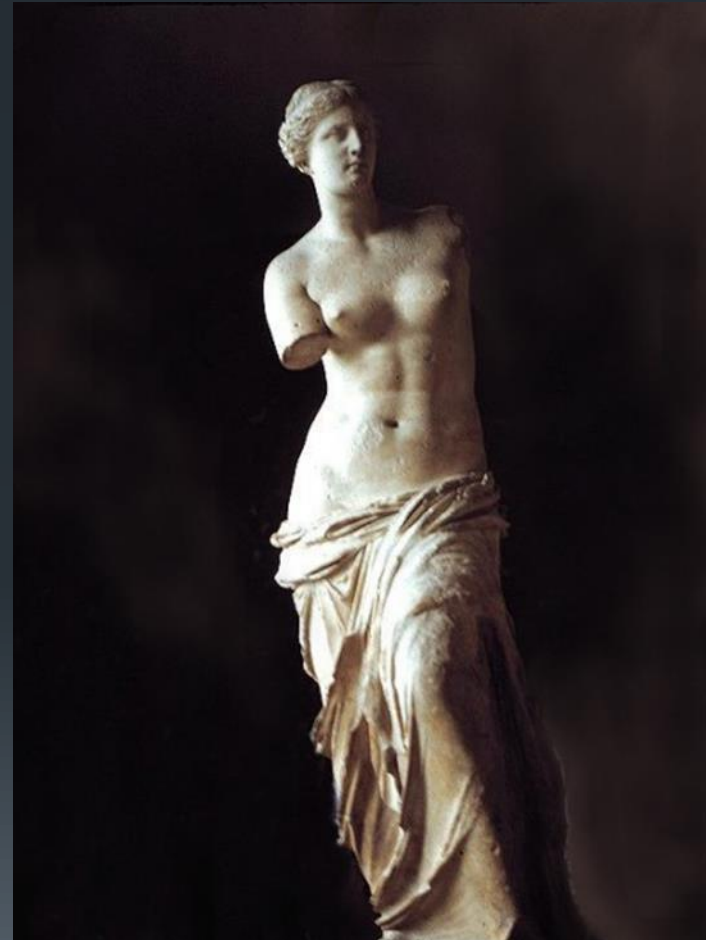

# Disability Studies?


- From “study disabilities” to “disability Studies”
- Disability studies/non-disability studies
  - ( Linton, Simi 1998)
  - liberal arts vs. Medical Model
  - Like women/gender studies, race/ethnicity studies, queer studies, recognizing the social oppression of minority groups (disabled people)



# Definition


- Guidelines for DS programs 2002
  - Challenges the dominance of medical, individual, deficit-based models of disability (while not dismissing their contributions)
  - Considers disability part of the continuum of human experience
  - Examines the environmental and social barriers to greater participation
  - Interdisciplinary approach

(Cushing and Smith 2009)

      - rename Disability Studies Quarterly 1985 ;

      - The Society for Disability Studies, 1986

# Growth of disability studies

- in US, Canada, UK, Australia, NZ
  - Independent DS departments
  - Hybridization with applied disciplines
  - Integration within the liberal arts

# A Brief History: The Disability Rights Movements in Taiwan:1980-2006

- 1981-1987
  - The emergence of the movements: Christian churches, Liu Hisa, and parents' associations
- 1988-1992
  - The alliance and institutionalization of the disability rights social movement organizations
    - The League for Persons with Disabilities (身心障礙聯盟(殘障聯盟)) Founded in 1990
    - Parents Association for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities, Taiwan (中華民國智障者家長總會) Founded in 1992
- 1993-2006
  - Engaging in Public Policies
- 2007-2014
  - “New” Disabled people's movement



# The development of disability rights movement in Taiwan

- Disability “welfare” movement in Taiwan
  - Focus on social welfare
  - Mostly Charity-oriented NGOs, speak for disabled people or service providers
  - Led mostly by Professionals, lack of the disabled people’s participation,
- New generation of disabled people’s movement since mid 2000
  - Disability Rights Action Alliance (network based social movement)

# Major legislation

- People with Disabilities Rights Protection Act (身心障礙者權益保障法，身權法)
  - 1980 Handicapped Welfare Act (殘障福利法)
  - 1997 Physically and Mentally Disabled Citizens Protection Act(身心障礙者權益保護法)
    - Incorporate “social model”
  - Renamed in 2007
  - CRPD 2014

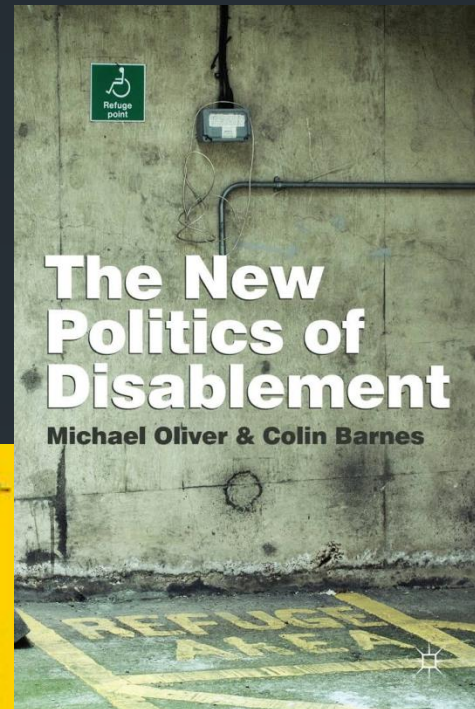

# “Special” education for the blind in Taiwan

- Education for the disabled people in the “west”
  - Isolation, segregation, integration and inclusion
  - Pre-industrial, industrial and post-industrial
- Taiwan
  - Colonial legacy, Japanese colonial period (1895-1945)
    - Blind school in agricultural society
  - Post-WWII,
    - Inclusive education in industrial society

# From charity to rights?

- Politics of naming
- From “殘障”(handicapped) to 身心障礙者 (disabled people)
  - More charity, not “human rights”
  - Hegemony of charity

# Localization of ICF

- Bring social model to Taiwan or medicalized disability
  - More assessments by medical professionals, more time on assessment
  - No significant budget based on social model
  - Medicalization of disability by ICF?



# Challenges

- Institutionalization or connecting to grassroots DPO ?
  - Institutionalization
    - Research center? Degree program? Or
  - Relationship between academic and DPOs/NGOs

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- Localization of disability studies ?
    - From post-colonial critique to localized theories
    - Individualism, family and community
    - A East Asian Perspective Disability Studies
      - Policy implications
        - Deinstitutionalization
        - Legal capacity and guardianship



- Intersectionality
  - Gender, sexuality, class/labor, ethnicity





- Interdisciplinary

- Dialogue with “traditional” disability field
- Communication between different fields
- Change of academic environment
  - Applied research, positivism
  - Publication requirement
  - Did not encourage Interdisciplinary work
